Gujarat education department announces common academic calendar for UG & PG courses

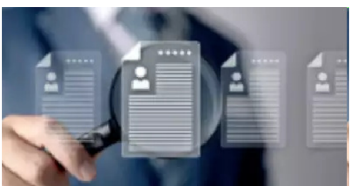
Begin from June 21. Diwali holiday will begin from November 10 and the vacation for all universities including GTU will be the same duration. Universities will conduct first internal evaluations from December 1-16. Second academic session, UG semester 2, 3 and PG semester 2, 4, will begin from December 2023 and end on April 20, 2024.

Ahmedabad: The state education department in India has released a common academic calendar for undergraduate and postgraduate courses starting from June 1, and ending on April 30, the following year. Universities have been given 20 days to complete the admission process. The state education department on Friday announced a common academic calendar for undergraduate and postgraduate courses. According to the calendar, universities have been asked to begin the admission process on June 1 and complete it before June 20 after the Class 12 results are announced. Sources in the department said that the academic calendars are announced every year but the universities do not adhere to it.

Govt restructures format for recruitment of clerks

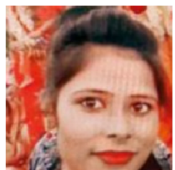


GANDHINAGAR: The Gujarat government on Friday restructured the format for recruitment of Class III employees which include head clerks, senior clerks and junior clerks in government service.

Announcing the Gujarat Subordinate Services, Class III (Group A and Group B) (Combined Competitive Examination) Rules 2023, the state government said that the examination will be held in two phases - the first being a primary qualifying exam and the second being the main examination. Under the new format, the vacancies of clerks in the government will be bifurcated into two parts.

Teen girl trying to protect mother stabbed 17 times

SURAT: City police arrested a 45-year-old migrant worker on Friday for allegedly killing his 19-year-old daughter and attacking his wife and sons.



died on the spot sustaining injuries on vital organs," said a police officer.

The accused stabbed his daughter 17 times as she tried to protect her mother in the grisly attack.

Accused Ramanuj Sahoo then attacked his wife, Rekha (40), stabbing her 10 times besides chopping off two fingers.

After the girl collapsed on the floor, the woman ran towards the terrace to save her life with her husband chasing her and stabbing her there too.

The police arrested Sahoo near his home in Kadodra GIDC area for the murder and attack on his wife.

The mother suffered at least 10 stabbing injuries and two of her fingers were chopped off.

Sahoo, a textile mill worker, killed his daughter Chanda and injuring his wife. In the attack, their three sons Suraj (16), Dhiraj (14) and Vishal (12) too suffered injuries while trying to save their mother.

She has been operated upon to attach the fingers and is still admitted in the hospital," said the police.

The couple developed a dispute over going to the terrace to sleep at night. Later, Sahoo went out and returned after some time and attacked Rekha with a knife.

Cops are questioning the accused to find out exactly what conspired between them prior to developing the dispute over going to sleep on the terrace.

As the accused is still not revealing details, the police may seek custody for further investigation.

Can't sue hospital after free treatment: Consumer panel

AHMEDABAD: The Gujarat State Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission has said that a government hospital like the Civil Hospital in Ahmedabad that provides free of charge treatment to patients cannot be sued for deficiency in service.

Rajar taluka in Kutch had brought his wife Jyeshtha for treatment in 2012. She was advised for a surgery known as splenectomy. She did not get any respite even after the surgery and her pain persisted.

As the treatment was free of charge, the commission said, "Even the payment of token charge will not be treated as 'consideration' to fall within the scope of service."

The commission refused to entertain a complaint against the Civil Hospital and its doctors for deficiency in service when they appeared to have forgotten an instrument like scissors inside a patient's stomach after a surgery.

Chavda alleged negligence on part of the doctors involved in her first surgery and deficiency in service on part of the hospital and claimed Rs 85 lakh in compensation.

The record shows that the patient was given treatment at Civil Hospital, Ahmedabad, and it is free service because no record shows that complainant has paid any fees. Thus, when the 'treatment rendered to patient is not service', the complainant is not a 'consumer'.

SoBo accountant sextorted out of Rs 4 lakh by Insta friend

AHMEDABAD: A 22-year-old woman from South Bopal, who works as an accountant with a private firm, on Thursday filed a complaint with the Bopal police alleging that a man from Isanpur, who was her friend on Instagram, extorted Rs 1 lakh and gold worth Rs 1 lakh from her while threatening to make her nude pictures viral.

The woman said in her FIR that a man named, Jay Nagor, sent her a request to follow her on April 5 which she accepted. She accepted the request on April 7 and they began chatting.

In the first week of May, Nagor convinced her to send nude pictures of her to him which she did. On May 12, Nagor sent her a message demanding Rs 1 lakh from her. "He threatened me that if I will not give him money then he would make her nude pictures viral on social media. Scared, I sent him money through UPI on May 13," she said in the complaint.

On May 14, he again sent her a message seeking gold threatening her of making her pictures viral. The woman then stole jewellery worth Rs 1 lakh from her house and handed over the jewellery to Nagor at her office in Bopal. On May 17, when her mother checked the cupboard in their house, she did not find the jewellery and decided to report police. At that time, the girl told her mother that she had taken the jewellery and gave them to her Instagram friend. She narrated the entire story to file a police complaint.

She reported a complaint of extortion, breach of trust, cheating, defamation and criminal intimidation under IPC along with the charges of the Information Technology act.
